

Student State Determination for Programs that lead to Professional Licensure or Certification

Academic programs at the University of Georgia (UGA) that are designed to meet educational requirements for a specific professional license or certification that is required for employment in an occupation or that advertise as meeting such requirements must provide students with information regarding whether completion of that program would be sufficient to meet licensure requirements in the state in which the student is located.

Definitions

Programs that lead to professional licensure or certification: Academic programs at UGA that
are designed to meet educational requirements for a specific professional license or
certification that is required for employment in an occupation or that are advertised as
meeting such requirements.

2. State in which the student is located:

- a. Residential Programs: For UGA programs that are conducted in-person and necessitate students to complete more than 50% of the program on the main campus in Athens, GA, or at a UGA-approved off-campus instructional site in Georgia, the state in which the student is located shall be recognized as Georgia. This applies to all students enrolled in such residential programs.
- b. Distance Programs: For UGA programs that permit students to reside in states other than Georgia while completing their programs, through online delivery methods, the state in which the student is located will be defined as the state listed on their application for admission to the University. These programs are obliged to provide a letter of direct disclosure to each student prior to enrollment in the program.
